What is the overall deductible? If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?	Yes. The following services are not subject to <u>deductible</u> : <u>emergency room care</u> , <u>emergency medical transportation</u> and spinal manipulations.	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes
