| What is the overall <u>deductible</u>? | For In-Network: \$0 Individual/\$0 Family For Out-of-Network: \$5,000 Individual/\$10,000 Family | Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> . |
| Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u>? | Yes. Certain <u>preventive care</u> , services that charge a <u>copayment</u> , and <u>prescription drugs</u> are covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . | This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. | Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services? | Yes. \$2,000 <u>deductible</u> for In-Network hospital admission. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met. |
| What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u>? | <u>Premiums</u> , <u>balance-billing</u> charges, and health care this <u>plan</u> doesn't cover. | Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> . |

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Your Rights to Continue Coverage: There are agencies that can help if you want to continue your coverage after it ends. Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

Minimum Essential Coverage generally includes plans, health insurance available through the Marketplace or other individual market policies, Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, TRICARE, and certain other coverage. If you are eligible for certain types of Minimum Essential Coverage, you may not be eligible for the premium tax credit.

Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Yes
